Dr. Emerson B. Powery—Associate Professor of Theology and Chair of the Department of Theology at Lee University, Cleveland, Tennessee. A member of the Church of God, Dr. Powery is the author of *Jesus Reads Scripture*, co-editor of *The Spirit and the Mind*, and is a lead editor of the forthcoming *African American Commentary on the New Testament*.

Dr. Peter E. Enns—Associate Professor of Old Testament at Westminster Theological Seminary, Pennsylvania. Dr. Enns is the author of *Exodus Retold: Ancient Exegesis of the Departure from Egypt in Exodus 10:15-21 and 19:1-9 (NIV Application Commentary)*; *Inspiration and Incarnation: Evangelicals, Scripture, and the Problem of the Old Testament*; and a contributor to *The New Interpreter's Study Bible*.

Mrs. Celia B. Sinclair—Lecturer in Religious Studies Department at the University of North Carolina at Charlotte. An Episcopalian, Mrs. Sinclair is the author of several books, including *Genesis (Interpretation Bible Series)*, *A Guide Through the Old Testament*, and *A Guide Through the New Testament*.

Dr. Thomas B. Dozeman—Professor of Old Testament at United Theological Seminary in Dayton, Ohio. Dr. Dozeman is a member of the Presbyterian Church. He is co-chair of the Pentateuch Section, Society of Biblical Literature and author of: *The Book of Exodus (The Abingdon Study Bible)*, *Exodus (New International Biblical Commentary Series)*, and *God at War: Power in the Exodus Tradition*. He also wrote the commentary on Exodus for *The New Interpreter's Bible*.

Dr. Cheryl B. Anderson—Assistant Professor of Old Testament at Garrett-Evangelical Theological Seminary, Evanston, Illinois. An ordained member of the Baltimore/Washington Conference of The United Methodist Church, Dr. Anderson has written "Lessons Learned in the Wilderness," meditations for *Upper Room Disciplines 2003* and was a video presenter for DISCIPLE: UNDER THE TREE OF LIFE.

Dr. Kathleen A. Farmer—Professor of Old Testament and Director of Masters Studies at United Theological Seminary in Dayton, Ohio. She is a United Methodist and author of *Who Knows What Is Good? A Commentary on Proverbs and Ecclesiastes*, the article on Psalms in *The Women's Bible Commentary*, and the commentary on Ruth for *The New Interpreter's Bible*.

Dr. Jin Hee Han—Professor of Biblical Studies at New York Theological Seminary, New York. A member of the Presbyterian Church (USA), Dr. Han is a contributor to *The Anchor Bible Dictionary*.

Dr. Julia M. O'Brien—Paul H. and Grace L. Stern Professor of Old Testament at Lancaster Theological Seminary, Lancaster, Pennsylvania, where she has taught since 1997. She is a member of the United Church of Christ and the author of *Abingdon Old Testament Commentary—Nahum, Habakkuk, Zephaniah, Haggai, Zechariah, Malachi*.

Dr. Melody D. Knowles—Assistant Professor of Hebrew Scriptures at McCormick Theological Seminary, Chicago, Illinois. A candidate for holy orders in the Episcopal Church, Dr. Knowles is the author of several articles on Ezra and Nehemiah. She is co-chair of the Board of Trustees at Brent House, the Episcopal Chaplaincy at the University of Chicago.

Rev. Mark Price—Senior Editor of DISCIPLE Bible study resources, Abingdon Press, Nashville, Tennessee. For more than fifteen years, Rev. Price has served as a Christian Educator and/or pastor of churches in Kentucky, Georgia, and Virginia. Before joining the DISCIPLE editorial team, he served on the national DISCIPLE leadership training team.

Dr. Daniel L. Smith-Christopher—Professor of Old Testament at Loyola Marymount University, Los Angeles, California. Dr. Smith-Christopher is a member of the Society of Friends (Quakers). He is author of *A Theology of Exile* and *The Old Testament: Our Call to Faith & Justice*. He edited *Subverting Hatred: Nonviolence in World Religions* and wrote the commentary on Daniel for *The New Interpreter's Bible*.

Dr. Sidnie W. Crawford—Professor of Hebrew Bible and Chair of Classics and Religious Studies at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. An ordained Episcopal priest, Dr. Crawford is also the president of the board of trustees, W. F. Albright Institute for Archaeological Research, Jerusalem. She is author of *The Book of Esther in Modern Research* and wrote the commentaries on Esther and The Additions to Esther for *The New Interpreter's Bible*.

Dr. Michael J. Brown—Assistant Professor of New Testament at Candler School of Theology, Emory University, Atlanta, Georgia. Dr. Brown is a member of the African Methodist Episcopal Church and is currently researching early Christian interpretations of the Lord's Prayer. He is author of *The Blackening of the Bible: The Aims of African American Biblical Interpretation* and *The Lord's Prayer Through North African Eyes: A Window into Early Christianity*.

Dr. Thomas E. Boomershine—G. Ernest Thomas Professor of Christianity and Communication at United Theological Seminary, Dayton, Ohio. Dr. Boomershine is an ordained elder of The United Methodist Church and a member of the West Ohio Annual Conference. He is co-founder and vice president of Lumicon Digital Productions and the author of *Story Journey: An Invitation to the Gospel as Storytelling*.

Dr. R. Alan Culpepper—Dean of the McAfee School of Theology at Mercer University, Atlanta. A member of the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship, Dr. Culpepper has written seven books, including *Anatomy of the Fourth Gospel*, *The Gospel and Letters of John*, and the commentary on Luke for *The New Interpreter's Bible*.

Dr. Jaime Clark-Soles—Assistant Professor of New Testament at Perkins School of Theology, Southern Methodist University, Dallas, Texas. Dr. Clark-Soles is an ordained pastor of the American Baptist Church. Her teaching specialties include the Gospel of John and death and afterlife in the New Testament. She is author of *Scripture Cannot Be Broken: The Social Function of the Use of Scripture in the Fourth Gospel*.

Dr. Aida Besançon Spencer—Professor of New Testament at Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary, South Hamilton, Massachusetts. Dr. Spencer is a Presbyterian Church (USA) minister and a founding pastor of Pilgrim Church in Beverly, Massachusetts. She was born and reared in Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic and is the author of *Beyond the Curse: Women Called to Ministry*, *The Global God*, *God Through the Looking Glass*, and *The Prayer Life*.

Dr. Richard B. Hays—George Washington Ivey Professor of New Testament at The Divinity School, Duke University, in Durham, North Carolina. An ordained United Methodist minister, Dr. Hays is internationally recognized for his work on the letters of Paul and New Testament ethics. He has written numerous books and articles, including *The Faith of Jesus Christ*, *The Art of Reading Scripture*, and the commentary on Galatians for *The New Interpreter's Bible*.

Dr. Gay L. Byron—Associate Professor of New Testament and Black Church Studies in the Baptist Missionary Training School, and Chair of Biblical Interpretation at Colgate Rochester Crozer Divinity School in Rochester, New York. Dr. Byron is a minister of the Word and Sacrament in the Presbyterian Church (USA) and the author of *Symbolic Blackness and Ethnic Difference in Early Christian Literature*.

Dr. Brad R. Braxton—Associate Professor of Homiletics and New Testament at Vanderbilt Divinity School, Nashville, Tennessee. A member of the National Baptist Church (USA), Dr. Braxton is author of three books, including *Preaching Paul* and *No Longer Slaves: Galatians and African American Experience*.

Bishop Minerva G. Carcaño—Bishop of the Phoenix Area of The United Methodist Church. Bishop Carcaño has served as a local pastor, district superintendent, seminary administrator, and adjunct faculty member. She has written for *Response*, *Wellsprings*, *Apuntes*, and numerous meditations for women and contributions to Spanish Program Books. She collaborated in development of *Follow Me* (confirmation material for youth) and served as a consultant to the New Interpreter's Bible commentary project.

Dr. David A. deSilva—Professor of New Testament and Greek at Ashland Theological Seminary, Ashland, Ohio. Dr. deSilva is a United Methodist whose publications include *An Introduction to the New Testament: Contexts, Methods, and Ministry Formation*; *Perseverance in Gratitude: A Socio-rhetorical Commentary on the Epistle "to the Hebrews,"* and *Paul and the Macedonians*, part of The Life and Letter of Paul series.

Dr. Leticia A. Guardiola-Sáenz—Assistant Professor of New Testament at The Theological School of Drew University, Madison, New Jersey. A member of the American Baptist Church, Dr. Guardiola-Sáenz was formerly the Orlando Costas Professor of Latin American and Hispanic Ministries and Assistant Professor of New Testament at Andover Newton Theological School, Newton Centre, Massachusetts.

Dr. Craig C. Hill—Professor of New Testament at Wesley Theological Seminary, Washington, DC. An ordained elder of The United Methodist Church and member of the Illinois Great Rivers Annual Conference, Dr. Hill is author of *In God's Time: The Bible and the Future*, *Hellenists and Hebrews*, and the commentary on Romans in *The Oxford Bible Commentary*.

Mr. John S. Mogabgab—Editor of *Weavings: A Journal of the Christian Spiritual Life*. Mr. Mogabgab is an Episcopal layperson with degrees in theology from Union Theological Seminary (New York) and Yale University. He served as Henri Nouwen's teaching, research, and editorial assistant at Yale Divinity School from 1975 to 1980 and is now a member of the Henri Nouwen Society Board of Directors.

Dr. Zan W. Holmes, Jr.—Retired Pastor of St. Luke Community United Methodist Church in Dallas, Texas, and former Adjunct Professor of Preaching at Perkins School of Theology, Southern Methodist University. A United Methodist, he has served as a district superintendent and as a member of the Judicial Council of The United Methodist Church. Dr. Holmes is a former member of the Texas state legislature and author of *Encountering Jesus*.
