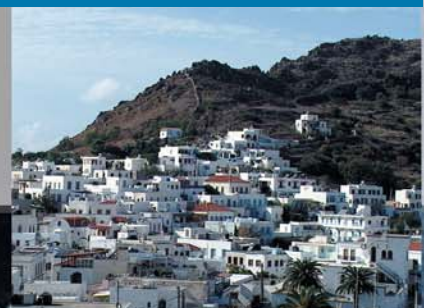

The Life and Teachings of Paul

Nov. 4 and 5: Departure and arrival in Athens, Greece. Begin your **DISCIPLE STUDY FIELD TRIP** as you depart from the United States and arrive in Athens, Greece. In Athens, you will be met by our representative and transferred to your Athens hotel for dinner and overnight.

Nov. 6: Athens and Corinth: The architectural splendors of the ancient city of Athens are as magical as ever! Follow your guide on a journey to the ancient **Acropolis**, where you will see the **Propylaea**, the **Parthenon**, and the **Erechtheion**. **CALLED THROUGH GOD'S GRACE:** View **Mars Hill**, where **Paul preached the Gospel** to the intellectual Athenian community of his day (**Acts 17: 15-34**). View the **Agora**, the ancient market place and center of Athenian public life. **Paul also preached here to the skeptical Athenians.** See the Olympic Stadium, on the site where Olympics began, and modern Olympic games returned in 2004.

Travel to **Corinth (Acts 16: 1-18)**, the city providing the background for not only **Paul's Letters to the Corinthians**, but insights into his character and mind, and vigorous presentation of the Gospel. Visit the archaeological museum, view the Market Place, and ancient Temple of Apollo (6th century BC). Walk the area Paul knew so well. **THE POWER AND WISDOM OF GOD:** stand by the Bema where **Paul stood to proclaim the Gospel of Christ.** Walk down Harbor Street, lined with shops in Paul's day. **Read Paul's letter to the Corinthians** in the place where it took place.

Visualize Paul's address to the Gentiles as he began the foundation of the church at Corinth. Imagine **Aquila and Priscilla** living in Corinth, working in their tent-making business.

Later in the day, transfer to the mv. Cristal, in the port of Piraeus, for dinner and overnight. **Sail to Thessaloniki.**

Nov. 7: Veria, and Thessaloniki: Travel to **Veria: ancient Berea.** See the memorial commemorating **Paul preaching to the Jews in 54 AD (Acts 17: 10-12).** Still visible in Veria is part of the Roman road once extending from Rome to Istanbul – the **Via Egnatia**, a silent witness to Rome's expansion in Paul's day.

Travel to **Thessaloniki**, second largest city in Greece and capital of the Roman province of Macedonia. **THE POWER OF THE SPIRIT.** **Paul preached in Thessaloniki** during the winters of 49-50 AD (**Acts 17: 1-9**), writing two letters to the gathered church in Thessaloniki.

View the ramparts of the city, the triumphal Arch of Galerius, and see part of the Via Egnatia See the **Roman Agora where Paul preached.** The **Monastery of Vlatadon** was built on the location of **Jason's house (Acts 17:5)** where Paul stayed during his visit to Thessaloniki. From the Upper Town, view the present city. Return to the mv. Cristal for dinner and overnight.

Nov. 8: Kavala and Philippi: Visit **Kavala (ancient Neapolis)**, one of the most picturesque and principal seaports of eastern Macedonia. **Paul landed here with his disciples, Timothy and Silas (Acts 16: 11, 12).** In Kavala, note the beauty of the port, see the Roman aqueduct and view the acropolis. **THE WORD OF THE LORD:** In **Philippi, Paul was moved to witness his faith in Christ** to women gathered by a river. Among them was **Lydia, a cloth merchant, who became the first Christian to be baptized in Europe.** Visit the river location where this event is remembered: **Lydia's baptismal site.** In the city area of **Philippi**, visit a cistern, which in Roman times is thought to have been the **prison in which Paul and Silas were kept.** At that time, divided into two rooms: one for the jailor and one for prisoners.

View the **acropolis of Philippi.** See the **Basilicas, market place**, another section of the **Roman Egnatia Road** as it continues its way to Rome, and the **Roman theatre.** **HAVING THE MIND OF CHRIST:** The New Testament **Book of Philippians** is Paul's correspondence to the church in this city. It is to the Philippians' community

that St. Paul notes how to **SEE GOOD COMING OUT OF BAD!** (**Philippians 1: 12-18**). Later in the day return to the mv. Cristal for dinner and overnight. **Sail for Dikili, Turkey.**

Nov. 9: On our way to **Patmos and Ephesus** we dock at **Dikili, Turkey**, to visit **Pergamon**, one of the **Seven Churches of Revelation.** **Christianity reached Pergamon** very early. The church at Pergamon was addressed by **John the Revelator (Rev. 2: 12-17)** as one of the Seven Churches. Although they had the **POWER TO BEAR FRUIT (St. John 15: 1-8)**, the inhabitants of the city were condemned for their false doctrines (**Rev. 2: 12-15**). Those who held to their faith in Christ were promised a "white stone" and a "new name." (**Rev. 2: 17**). **The first Christian to die at the hands of a Roman state, Antipas, was put to death at Pergamon (Revelation 2:13).**

View the temples of Athena and Trajan. See the Grand Theatre, the Gymnasium and Health Center area. You will also see the remains of Pergamon's famous Library, having contained 200,000 volumes of material on parchment paper, second only to the library in Alexandria, Egypt. Pergamon introduced the "paged book" and when Egypt cut off its supply of papyrus, re-introduced the use of skins for writing. Our word "parchment" comes from the use of these "Pergamon pages." After visiting Pergamon, return to the mv. Cristal for dinner and overnight.

Nov. 10: The Island of Patmos and Monastery of St. John the Theologian. When you awake, you will be docked in **Scala Harbor**, on the **Island of Patmos.** After breakfast, leave for a "field trip" to the **Monastery of St. John.** Although there is no record that Paul visited Patmos, St. John's earlier years were impacted by the Paul's life and witness. **Visit the Monastery of St. John the Theologian**, on the mountain overlooking part of the Island and Scala Harbor. The Monastery is only second to the Vatican in Rome for its religious art and artifacts. The Monastery dates to 1088 and was fortified against threats of piracy. Visit the **Grotto of the Apocalypse, where the exiled John lived and wrote the Book of Revelation and other correspondence to the early church.** Return to the mv. Cristal for dinner and overnight. This afternoon, the mv. Cristal will sail for **Kusadasi, port city for Ephesus.**

Nov. 11: Kusadasi and Ephesus. We travel by bus a short distance (12 miles) from Kusadasi to **Ephesus, the Marble city.** Ephesus is one of the best-preserved ancient classical cities in the eastern Mediterranean, an important seaport harbor as early as 600 BC. With time and silt, the Sea is now about 4 miles away. **Paul spent more than two years of his ministry in Ephesus (Acts 19: 10)**, a crossroad for culture, travel, and trade: one of the largest cities of the Roman world. See the Small Theatre, the reconstruction of the facade of the Celsus Library (contained 12,000 scrolls); the Roman theatre seating 24,000. Visit the Agora (shop area), walk the marble pathways, picture the grandeur of the city in Paul's time. See parts of restored mosaic walkways.

In Ephesus, Paul's **Letter to the Ephesians** indicates his witness for Christ in midst of this Roman city of his time. In Ephesus, **Paul confronted Demetrius**, the silversmith (**Acts 19: 21-41**). Roman soldiers with their armor were a common sight. When Paul used the words **"PUT ON THE WHOLE ARMOR OF GOD," (Ephesians 6:11)**, the people knew exactly what he meant. They were familiar with breastplate, belt, shoes, shield, and helmet. **Ephesus provided a challenging environment in which to preach Paul's world-embracing Gospel of Christ.** Time will be taken for reflection and a **Service of Holy Communion.** Return to the mv. Cristal for dinner and overnight, while docked at Kusadasi.

Nov. 12: Miletus (Acts 20: 13-38): an important Roman city in Paul's time. At that time, Miletus was located on the coast with two harbors. The importance and size

of the city is noted by its theatre, then seating 15,000. Paul was here on his 3rd missionary journey, on his way to Jerusalem. While in Miletus, Paul called the elders of the church at Ephesus to come and meet with him. "REMEMBER WHO YOU ARE" Paul's address to the elders, prayer, and farewell (Acts 20: 18-38) left the elders "grieving" and "weeping" knowing they would not see him again. "Then they brought him to the ship" (Acts 20: 38b) to sail for Jerusalem. In Miletus, see the Roman theatre (expanded in the 2nd century to 25,000 seats), and extensive remains of this important Greek and Roman city, dating to 1400 BC.

It is fitting that we end our Disciple Pilgrimage regarding the life and ministry of St. Paul in Miletus, with his farewell address to leadership of the church

in Asia Minor before leaving for Jerusalem, and then to Rome for his final days. We have gained insights into Paul's life, ministry, and Christian witness. May this travel experience refresh and renew our personal Christian witness and commitment as 21st Century disciples of Christ.

Note: Those taking the Istanbul, Cappadocia, and the Church in Asia Minor Post-Tour, will disembark today and be on separate buses from the rest of the group. All other passengers will sail back to Athens.

Nov. 13: Return home or Begin a Post-Tour. After an early breakfast, transfer to the airport for your international flight. **Return home with new images and a new appreciation for the life and teachings of St. Paul, and, St. John.**

Nov 1 & 2- USA to Istanbul

Depart USA and arrive in Istanbul. Transfer to hotel for dinner and overnight.

Nov 3 - Istanbul - Topkapi, St. Sophia, Blue Mosque, Grand Bazaar

Nov 4 - Istanbul Enjoy a free day in **Istanbul** or participate in an optional **Bosphorus cruise** (additional cost) to see the many highlights of Istanbul from the sea. Overnight in Istanbul.

Nov 5 - Istanbul to Athens Fly to Athens transfer to hotel for dinner and overnight. Depending on your flight, you will either have free time today in Istanbul or Athens. Tomorrow begin day 3 of the basic itinerary.

Delphi/Meteora Pre-Tour \$398

Nov 2 & 3 USA to Athens Arrive Athens for overnight.

Nov 4 Delphi Your visit to Delphi will take you along the **Sacred Way** to the **Athenian Treasury**, the **Theatre** and the **Temple of Apollo**. You'll visit the **Museum** where you will see the unique 5th century B.C. bronze charioteer. Continue to Kalambaka for overnight.

Nov 5 Meteora In the rock forest of **Meteora**, famous **Byzantine monasteries** perch precariously on summits of soaring, sheer-sided grey rock pinnacles. You will visit one of these monasteries. Return to Athens via the **Thermopylae Pass**, where 300 Spartans stood against 30,000 Persians. Tomorrow begin day 3 of the basic itinerary.

Athens Pre-Tour \$198

Nov 3 & 4 USA to Athens Arrive Athens for overnight.

Nov 5 Athens You are **on-your-own** to enjoy sightseeing, shopping and exploring Athens at your own pace. Tomorrow begin the Athens/Corinth day of Basic itinerary.

Cairo and Luxor Post-Tour \$1298

Nov 13 - Cairo Fly to Cairo with time on own to explore. Dinner and overnight at the hotel.

Nov 14 - Cairo Visit to the **Egypt Museum of Cairo** which houses the King Tut treasures and many other artifacts from Egypt's long history. Continue to the **Great Pyramids of Giza**, and see this last remaining ancient wonder which was built before the time of Moses and the Israelites in this ancient land.

Nov 15 - Luxor (Lunch is included today.) Fly to Luxor. Cross the Nile River to visit the **Valley of Kings and Queens**. Overnight in Luxor.

Nov 16 - Luxor (Lunch is included today.) Visit the magnificent **Karnak Temple** and the smaller **Luxor Temple**. Fly back to Cairo for overnight.

Nov 17 - Return to USA

Istanbul, Cappadocia and the Church in Asia Minor Post-Tour \$798

Nov 12 - Miletus and Aphrodisias Disembark the ship this morning and visit **Miletus** with its extensive ruins. Here Paul met and exhorted the elders of Ephesus for the last time in Acts 20:17-36. Continue to the ancient city of Aphrodisias, one of the centers for sculpture in the ancient world. Explore to archaeological site before continuing to **Pamukkale** for overnight.

Nov 13 - Colossae, Laodicea, and Hierapolis Famous as the

receiver of Paul's Letter to the Colossians, the town of **Colossae** has fallen into obscurity. The Christians of **Laodicea**, one of the Seven Churches (Rev. 3: 14-22), were chastised for being lukewarm. Today, there are many acres of ruins to see, including the stadium and columned streets. Paul mentions **Hierapolis** in his Letter to the Colossians in saluting Epaphras, a fellow laborer, for his love of the brethren there (Col 4: 13). Today, the area is known as **Pamukkale**, meaning "Cotton Castle", named for the limestone-laden hot springs which cascade from one white-edged terrace pool to the next.

Nov 14 - Antioch in Psidia and Iconium Travel to the remains of **Antioch** in Psidia where Paul and Barnabas ministered in the synagoge (Acts 13:14-52) and converted many of the Gentiles in the city. Continue to the modern Turkish city of **Konya** which was ancient **Iconium** (Acts 14:1-6) for overnight.

Nov 15 - Derbe and Lystra Travel to the cities of **Derbe** and **Lystra**. While little remains of either city, Paul and Barnabas spent much time preaching there and were even stoned and left for dead in Lystra (Acts 14:6-22). Continue to the **Cappadocia** region for overnight.

Nov 16 - Cappadocia Tour **Cappadocia** where over 3000 rock churches exist. You will visit the **Rock Chapels of Goreme**, the **Cave Village of Avclar** and the **Monastic Complex of Zelve**. Late this afternoon, fly to Istanbul where you will overnight.

Nov 17 - Istanbul - Topkapi, St. Sophia, Blue Mosque, Grand Bazaar

You will visit the famous **Blue Mosque** with its six minarets and sparkling interior. You will also visit the **Topkapi Palace**, once home to royal Sultans. Inside, you will see the fabled jewels of the Treasury, delicate displays of Chinese porcelain in the Kitchen Quarters, and the provocative Harem Quarters. Nov 17 Valley of Kings and Queens Disembark and cross to the Western Bank where you will visit the **Necropolis of Thebes**, the **Valley of the Kings and Queens**, the **Temple of Hatshepsut** and the **Colossi of Memnon**. On the East Bank, you'll visit the amazing **Temples of Luxor and Karnak**. Fly to Cairo for dinner and overnight.

Nov 18 Egyptian Museum, Old Cairo, Giza Pyramids and Sphinx Today, see the **Great Pyramids of Giza** and the **Sphinx**. Admire the ancient treasures of the **Egyptian Museum**.

Nov 19 Return Depart Cairo and arrive in the USA.
